South Padre Island is a gem in the Laguna Madre community located at the tropical tip of Texas. Sometimes referred to as the "third coast," the sparkling blue waters of the Gulf of Mexico border the Island on the east and the incredibly beautiful Laguna Madre Bay is on the west.

Uncongested beaches and miles and miles of sand dunes are found on the beaches of South Padre Island. Our beaches are consistently rated among the top in the United States (rated #1 by Condé Nast). Water sports of all kinds are prominent including fishing, kiteboarding, kayaking, etc.



South Padre Island experiences a humid subtropical climate, similar to that of Florida but with less precipitation and slightly higher summer maximum temperatures.

The warm season is long, as the average high temperatures are 90-99° F(32-37° C), and the average low temperatures typically around 77° F(25° C).. The region experiences relatively high dew point values, around 75° F(24° C) in the summer time, resulting in higher relative humidity values from June through September.

Average **wind speeds** are about **18 MPH**, which makes it seem cooler in summer and ideal for water sports and activities.

TAX BURDEN BY STATE

Top State to Relocate:

According to Allied Van Lines 42nd Annual Magnet States Report, Texas is the No. 1 destination state for residential relocations for the 5th year in a row. New data from the U.S. Census Bureau confirms that Texas gained more residents than any other state, and had the 3rd largest percentage growth.

Texas homes are more affordable. Using a ratio of the average family income compared to income required to qualify for a loan, the Housing Affordability Index indicates the proportion of the population that can afford to buy the average home sold during a certain time period. CITY GOVERNMENT

The City of South Padre Island has a council-manager form of government, operating under a Home Rule Charter. There is a City Council with 5 council members and presiding Mayor which serve on a “Place” system. They serve 3-year staggered terms.

City Council elections are held in November. To vote in the election, you must register 30 days prior to the election (see voting registration).

The City Manager is the chief executive officer for the City. Under the City Manager are key department heads including the Public Works Director, Police Chief, Fire Chief, Finance Director and City Attorney.

The City Council meets on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month at 5:30 p.m. at City Hall. These are public meetings and the public is encouraged to attend. Agendas are posted at City Hall and on the City’s website: www.MySPI.org.



PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Students from South Padre Island may attend public school in the Point Isabel Independent School District. There are two elementary schools and a high school in Port Isabel (right across the causeway). For more information, you may call 956-943-0000 or visit www.pi-isd.net.

The South Texas Independent School District (956-565-2454, www.stisd.net) includes five magnet schools in Mercedes and Donna (75 minutes away) specializing in science and medicine, a preparatory academy and business education and technology academy. These schools are listed among the top 100 schools in the nation.


SENIORS

The City of South Padre Island has capped municipal property taxes for citizens 65 and over.

The University of Texas, Brownsville allows anyone 65 or over to audit their classes for free.

Also, in the unlikely event of a hurricane evacuation, there is a service available for anyone who may need special health or transportation assistance by dialing 211 and registering ahead of time.



HISTORY

South Padre's rich history reads like an adventure novel. Recorded history begins in 1519 with a Spanish ship bound for the Gulf of Mexico. When passing South Padre Island the sailors called it Isla Blanca or White Island. Back then, the island

was inhabited by the Karankawa Indians, a tall people rumored to be cannibals.

After the Aztec people of Mexico were conquered by the Spanish, the numerous galleons headed for Mexican treasure found their way to the Gulf of Mexico. Several ships were lost to sand bars and storms, and three ships were sunk in 1553. The survivors of these three wrecks reportedly swam to the Padre shore where they were greeted by Indian arrows. Only two of the 300 surviving passengers made it to a safe haven in Mexico to tell their tales. Over the years, many of their coins and treasures have been recovered off Padre's shores. Treasure hunters still search for the lost riches.



We know that Jean Lafitte, the pirate noted for his role in the War of 1812, explored the South Padre territory. A well in Laguna Vista bears his name, and legend says he dug the well and returned often for fresh water.

The island is named after a Catholic missionary priest - Padre



Jose Nicolas Balli. He founded a settlement here in 1804 and ranched in the area. The statue in Isla Blanca Park, which welcomes fisherman and seaman safely home, is in his image. The Mexican government eventually gave title of the island to the priest.

John Singer, brother of the famous Singer Sewing machine inventor, took up residence on South Padre in 1847 when his ship was lost off the coast. Documents tell us that the family buried thousands in coins and jewelry before they fled during the Civil War. Their fortune was lost to the shifting dunes and remains somewhere on the island to this day.

Important historical battles took place in the area during both the Texas struggle for independence and the Civil War. The last battle was in May 1865. After this battle, Robert E. Lee surrendered to Ulysses S. Grant very near the Rio Grande Valley.

In the mid 1950's a man named John Tompkins idealized "Padre Beach" as a thriving seaside community. His efforts brought early development to the island in the early 60's. The island in those days was accessed by ferry and was largely a fishing village. That changed in 1974 with the completion of the Queen Isabella Causeway. At two and a half miles long, it is the longest bridge

in Texas.

The first homes, constructed in the late 60's and early 70's, are what locals refer to as "beach



houses." They were frequently built by World War II vets who had seen the Bali Ha'i building style of the South Pacific. Most were painted brightly with left-over paint and were built on wood pilings. These homes still stand as a testament to their construction and rugged storm smart style.

The earliest properties in the island include the Bahia Mar complex, the Tiki



Resort, The Padre South Hotel, and a few other wood frame hotels and condos on the beachfront. The majority of our resort and condo complexes were built in the early to mid 80's when there was a surge in development. That great time of progress stopped suddenly when the peso devalued and the savings and loan scandal upset the Texas economy.

Now the growth on South Padre Island is occurring at a solid and healthy pace. As the north island territory opens up, a new era of master planned communities and upscale development is anticipated.

VEHICLE REGISTRATION

The first thing that is required in the State of Texas is vehicle liability insurance.

Secondly, you must obtain a safety inspection for your vehicle. There are several service stations in area that do these inspections.

You can register your vehicle at any Tax Assessor-Collector Office in Cameron County. For information call (956) 943-8101

New registrants have 30 days to register their vehicle in their new county.



DRIVERS LICENSE

You get your Texas drivers' license at any Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) license bureau. For specific information check www.txdps.state.tx.us.

VOTERS REGISTRATION

To be eligible to register to vote in Texas, you must:

- be a U.S. citizen;
- be a resident of the county
- be 18 years old (you may register at 17 years and 10 months);
- not be a convicted felon (unless a person's sentence is completed, including any probation or parole)
- not be declared mentally incapacitated by a court of law



You may register to vote at anytime.



WINDSURFING



The Laguna Madre bay separates South Padre Island from the Texas mainland and is recognized as one of the world's top windsurfing destinations. The sailing season off South Padre runs from September through May. Water depth varies from three to five feet, daytime winds average 18 mph, and the average yearly temperature is in the 70s. Novices and pros come to sail the bay, the Jetties, Boca Chica, and the Ditch, site of some of the fastest windsurfing speeds in North America.

GOOLF

The Rio Grande Valley offers great golfing for handicappers of all levels. Keep in mind that our temperate climate allows golfers to tee off 12 months a year. The closest championship course is the South Padre Island Golf Club, located 15 minutes away. Other courses are located in Brownsville (30 minutes) and Harlingen (45 minutes). 
TENNIS

AREA ATTRactions



A satellite of the World Birding Center, which was established in 1999 through Texas Parks and Wildlife and U.S. Fish and Wildlife, the South Padre Island Birding and Nature Center is located just south of the South Padre Island Convention Centre on the north end of the Island, 6801 Padre Boulevard.

The new facility includes a 10,000 square foot Visitor's Center with exhibits that take visitors on an educational voyage from the waters of the Gulf of Mexico, through the dunes on our beautiful beaches and into the Laguna Madre Bay. These exhibits will teach you that nature includes our dunes, the seaweed, the plants on the dunes and much, much more. The center also features a gift shop, an auditorium, a half-mile of boardwalks and five bird blinds that run along the wetlands of the Laguna Madre.

The Whaling Wall

Wyland's Whaling Wall #53, named *Orcas off the Gulf of Mexico* is a mural that spans three walls of the South Padre Island Convention Centre. 


Port Isabel Lighthouse

For birders and nature-lovers, no visit to South Texas is complete without a stop at the Sabal Palm Audubon Center. The Center is home to many native species of plants and animals that reach the northernmost limit of their Mexican range here and do not occur elsewhere in the U.S. Cradled in a bend of the Rio Grande along the U.S./Mexico border, the Sabal Palm Audubon Center harbors one of the most beautiful and critical ecosystems of South Texas and Northern Mexico. Sabal Palms once grew profusely along the edge of the Rio Grande in small stands or groves extending about 80 miles upstream from the Gulf of Mexico. Today, only a small portion of that forest remains and is protected on 557 acres of this Audubon sanctuary. Open daily 7am - 5pm.

The Gladys Porter Zoo is a tropically landscaped, visitor-oriented zoological and botanical park, dedicated to the preservation of nature through education, conservation and research.

The Gladys Porter Zoo is located on 31-acres in central Brownsville, Texas. Visitors to the Gladys Porter Zoo will encounter a diverse ensemble of 377 species of animals and 225 species of plants. The park is divided into four zoogeographic areas: Africa, Asia, Tropical America and Indo-Australia. There is also a Herpetarium and Aquatic Wing, a Free-flight Aviary, Macaw Canyon, Bear Grottos, a California Sea Lion exhibit and Komodo dragon exhibit. Small World features a nursery and an animal contact yard where children can touch and interact with domesticated animals. Large numbers of wild birds find sanctuary on the Zoo grounds, drawn to the plants and waterways that provide them with food and shelter.

Iwo Jima Memorial Museum

This is the original sculpture used in casting the famous bronzed Marine Corps Memorial in Arlington, VA., depicting the raising of the US flag over Iwo Jima on Feb. 23, 1945, during World War II. It is over 100 feet high and weighs 130 tons. It was given to the Marine Military Academy in October of 1981.

A WWII museum located across the street from the statue displays many artifacts from that era and the more recent battles of "Desert Storm."

Considered the 'jewel' of the refuge system, this essential 'island' of thorn forest habitat is host or home to nearly 400 different types of birds and a myriad of other species, including the indigo snake, malachite butterfly and the endangered ocelot.


